37	2	<p>Refills are not allowed on a C-II prescription. There are limits on the quantities the prescriber can instruct the pharmacy to dispense. If the entire amount is not available at the time of presentation, a partial fill can occur. However, the pharmacy must dispense the remainder within 72 hr. Otherwise, the prescription expires and the patient will not receive the rest of the medication.</p> <p>In July 2016, the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act was signed into law. The law was enacted in an effort to combat the opioid epidemic. One of the changes in the law is to allow partial fills on C-II medications if requested by the patient or prescriber. In this circumstance, partial fills are allowed if the following conditions are met.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • State law does not prohibit partial fills of C-II medications. • The total quantity dispensed over all partial fills does not exceed the original quantity prescribed. • The partial fill is not dispensed later than 30 days after the original prescription was written. 	11/13/2017
